
"*These times, they are a changin';*" sang the great Bob Dylan. As we enter into 2023, Our Saviour will see some changes. For example, we know two members will move next year. We also know the post-Covid world has changed everything from the literal price of eggs to church attendance. Nothing seems to stay the same anymore, which is quite offputting to many.

To be honest, I am not a huge fan of change, but in church life, one has to expect it continually. The Church I started my ministry in is not the same Church 23 years later. People change, the world changes, and life continues to move forward.

Recently, I borrowed a lesson from one of Aesop's Fables—"Be the reed, not the oak." While Aesop borrowed this fable from the Greeks, the story is a mighty wind storm was coming. The oak tree boasted of its strength to withstand the storm. The reeds relied on their willingness to bend but not break. The storm comes and knocks down the oak as the winds challenge the oak by constantly changing the direction they are blowing from. The reeds survive because of their willingness to change direction with the wind. The idea is when facing change, and it is better to flow with it than resist it. Stubbornness will get you nowhere.

We are going to see some changes at Our Saviour, but I witnessed many changes throughout my career. The question we have to ask as a congregation is- do we resist these changes as the oak, or do we bend with them as reeds do?

In honor of the 90th anniversary of our church this year, the Social and Christian action committee members have decided to make 90 Personal Care Kits for Lutheran World Relief. This will require assistance from all who are able to do so. The contents of the kit are:

- 1 dark colored light weight towel size 27" X 52"
- 1 toothbrush in its wrapper
- 1 comb
- 1 nail clipper
- bar soap (8 to 9 ounces total) in original wrapper

These items may be brought to the Narthex of the church for collection. Monetary funds will also be used to purchase needed items to complete the kits.

The Life of Lorraine Hansberry**
Saturday February 11: 2-4pm

Join us for the kickoff event of CURE's third annual Five Towns, One Book celebration! Croton is thrilled to be a part of the county-wide event this year, as we focus on the multifaceted and brilliant Lorraine Hansberry with a new, inspired biography of her life. Dr. Soyica Diggs Colbert — Georgetown professor and author of *Radical Vision, A Biography of Lorraine Hansberry* — will participate in a roundtable chat with Lynda Jones of The Lorraine Hansberry Coalition in Croton, Tejash Sanchala, Executive Director of the Westchester Human Rights Commission, and Nicole Alifante of CURE. Dr. Colbert will answer questions from the audience and sign books afterwards.

The biography opens many entry points for discussion, reflection and learning as Ms. Hansberry was a writer, playwright, activist, feminist and part of the gay community at a time when it was not as accepted. She died of cancer at 35 years old but contributed more to the Freedom movement than most in her short life.

This is the kickoff for Five Towns, One Book! Additional events include:
