I've been talking a lot about change recently.

I finished teaching a class about evangelism in 2024, for example, to members of the Growing in Faith class. While some of the students are there to become deacons, several are members of church communities who want to grow deeper. The class I taught was on how to talk about Jesus in 2024.

I shared that when I was trained as a pastor, much of what I learned about evangelism was knocking on doors, creating flyers, creating programs, and "selling" your church. This was known as the programming model of church- having the right programs in place to make people want to come to your church. It was part of the church growth movement, which was a focus on growth and numbers in the pews. Flash forward to 2024 and the results of both ways of being church didn't work. Look at where most congregations are membership wise and discipleship wise.

What I taught is evangelism in 2024 is much more about listening to the community, working with the community, and being actively involved in the community by growing relationships and being present. There isn't a focus on numbers in the pews, but rather how connected we are with the community and building trust.

Compare the two of these models and you see how much change that involves. It means shifting at least 2-3 decades (yes, decades) of learning to back to a way of being church found originally in Acts. That is a lot of change and with change comes a lot of resistance and a desire to go back to thinking if we have the right thing in place, people will come. There is such a high mistrust of organized religion right now that even if the magic program were in place, no one would know. Building trust and relationship is how we become better disciples of Jesus. It was never about numbers.

The other major change is we have a new deacon! Think about how that will change ministry. Lifting up members of the community who want to serve in new ways, grow their faith, and lead aspects of ministry is what the church originally looked like in Acts.

(Having professional pastors and ministers do all the roles was never a good idea. Again, you see how well it worked and the results of this model. The church was always supposed to be a place where individuals grow their faith, use their spiritual gifts, and talk about their faith. It was never about 1 person doing all of the work of the church because 1 person cannot have all the gifts.

We have witnessed burn out of clergy, overworked clergy, and from 2020-2022 40% of clergy resigned on top of the 50% who quit within their first 1-2 years of ministry. Working together to be the body of Christ was always the model. Paul wrote about it at least 3 times.

Imagine if we had at least 4 people who were skilled in preaching, what might worship look like? What if more than 1 person was visiting the sick or homebound? What would relationships look like? This is what ministry in the church was always supposed to be, but to modern ears this is a huge change. Isn't it the pastor's job to do all those things? This question is usually the pushback I hear when I talk about this type of communal ministry, and it represents a desire for status quo.

We are entering the season of Pentecost when the Spirit blows and change happens. This was the lesson when she came the first time and it is the constant movement of church. The Spirit is moving, will we move with her?




PROPERTY MAINTENANCE
