

As Summer wanes and Fall arrives, we shift back into gear at Our Saviour and ready for the start of our regular programming. Adult Bible study will be back, a few special events will be announced, and we begin again as the leaves change outside. Fall is my favorite season, especially in the Hudson Valley.

Throughout the summer, the council and I were making plans for what is to come this Fall. In the Spring, we shared the idea of surveying the congregation to get a sense of where we are as a congregation. The council asked the congregation if we wanted to move forward with a survey tool called the Congregational Assessment Tool or CAT for short. The tool will be used to survey the congregation and the results will be shared with the council president and council. The results are compared to other congregations our size, so we can get a sense of the health and feelings of the congregation.

This September, we will be launching the survey. There will be two different ways one could take this- online which is the preferred method or with a paper survey. If one chooses the paper survey, a member of the council will need to input the responses on your behalf. With online input, only you will see your responses to the questions. The survey length will be two weeks long and it will then take another 3-6 weeks before we get our results.

Why we are doing this is the congregation has shifted after the shutdown from 2020-2021. Average attendance and giving has changed since Covid, as expenses increased. Our congregation has shifted with who is attending and who is no longer attending. Families moved and change occurred. It is not just our congregation, but faith organizations across the US have shifted following Covid. The council and I would like to get a sense of how the congregation is feeling a few years after the reopening of the congregation. Is the pastor still the right person? What direction and priorities should we have? Are people content?

Assessment and evaluation is always important in the life of the congregation as we move forward in mission. This will help the council make decisions and help with strategy on how we move forward. Thank you ahead of time for participating.

TREASURERS REPORT

A mid-year financial update

With the first half of the year gone, it might be useful to review how we are doing financially against our target budget. Like most things in life, there is good news and bad news. The good news is that our expenses for the first half of the year are about \$6,000 or 5% less than we planned. I will say that our expenses are not exactly equal each month, although we have made changes to equal it out. We are paying our benevolence monthly – which probably helps Synod and LWR as well to smooth out their income. Hopefully we will continue on this path with our reduced expenses and less of them than we expected.

On the other side of the coin it is not quite so good. Our income is about 15% down on where we wanted to be. This amounts to \$12,000. If this remains the same for the second half of the year — a big if, our deficit would be about \$12,000 worse than our approved budget. So instead of a deficit of almost \$29,000 it may be closer to \$41,000. The good thing is we have reserves available to cover this additional expense this year.

We do ask that each one of us can consider our own individual situations and see if we can increase the amount we give to the church. Karen and John Magerlein will be happy to help setup or change the Vanco automatic giving.

The last thing I have is that as you may have seen, in one of the recent storms we had a large tree come down in the old preschool playground. We have received a quote of \$2,100 to clean this up. We also have a quote of \$3,500 to remove the large spruce tree in front of the parish hall doors; however, Council has agreed that this can be held off for now. If you feel able to help financially with the removal of the downed tree, you can add to your donation and if you want it can be designated to property maintenance.
